

## AZALEAS

**DECIDUOUS AZALEAS** grow well in full sun and flower on young plants. Many are fragrant, have excellent fall foliage and the range of bloom colour extends to warm oranges and yellows.

<b>FRED GALLE REMEMBERED</b>	This is a late summer- blooming, open growing plant. The yellow-pink buds open apricot with a yellow flare.	- 15F	1 litre \$12
<b>SNOWBIRD</b>	Heavily scented white blooms appear early midseason before the blue-green foliage appears.	-15F	\$12
<b>TRI-LIGHTS</b>	A vigorous disease resistant azalea from the Minnesota program. It has white flowers with rippled darker pink and mauve edges.	-25F	\$25
<b>SCHLIPPENBACHIA</b>	The Royal Azalea is considered to be one of the best deciduous azaleas. Open-faced pink blooms appear on bare stems early in Spring. The leaves in Fall provide spectacular colour in tones of orange, red and burgundy on this very hardy species.	-25F	\$15

## Evergreen azaleas

These plants can be pruned to shape and some growers believe that if planted with protection from wind, sunnier locations can improve performance and hardiness

<b>CORSAGE</b>	Light lavender flowers in May on a plant that grows to 4'	-15F	1 L \$12
<b>GIRARD'S FUSCHIA</b>	This is an early spring bloomer with ruffled rich purple blooms on a compact plant. Dark green glossy foliage turns dark red in winter.	-10F	\$25
<b>JOHANNA</b>	Bright red flowers bloom midseason on this compact grower. Winter leaves turn rich dark red.	-10F	\$12
<b>KAREN</b>	Purple flowers in May on a plant with a reputation as one of the hardier evergreen azaleas.	-10F	\$10
<b>PINK CLUSTERS</b>	Ruffled pink flowers with an orange flare cover a dense bush midseason. Winter leaves turn bronze-red.	-15F	\$25
<b>PURPLE SPLENDOR</b>	Fripped dark purple hose-in-hose blooms cover the plant mid-season.	-15F	\$25
<b>ROSEBUD</b>	Double hose-in-hose pink flowers bloom midseason on this compact shrub.	-10F	\$25
