Acer truncatum	This smaller growing maple is resistant to drought and air pollution. Young leaves have a purplish overtone turning olive green with purple margins.	-20F	\$15

Metasequoia glyptostroboides	The "Dawn Redwood" was discovered as a "living fossil" in China in 1941, a deciduous conifer of vigorous upright habit with soft reddish brown bark exfoliating in long strips. 85' fast growing tree.	-10F	\$20

Oxydendron arboreum	A slow growing, acid loving specimen tree for sun has hanging panicles of white flowers in summer that persist changing to yellow then brown in contrast with the leaves. Yellow, red and orange fall colours and richly textured bark make this a four season tree.	-20F	\$25
Parrotia persica	This outstanding small tree develops multicoloured exfoliating bark with age. A late winter blooming cousin of witch hazel its subtle flowers have red stamens and the fall colour is outstanding. New leaves are edged maroon.	-20F	\$25

MAGNOLIAS

ACUMINATA	Native cucumber magnolia gets its name from the shape of the fruits that develop from green to red. A magnificent large growing tree but rare. It is on the endangered list in Ontario. Does well in deep moist well drained slightly acid soils but does not tolerate extreme drought, wetness or pollution.	-40 F	\$15 +
VIRGINIANA MOONGLOW	This swamp magnolia reportedly grows faster blooms sooner and is hardier than the regular form. The small white blooms in May are lemon scented and the semi-evergreen leaves have silvery undersides on this very pretty smaller-growing tree.	-15	\$65
